



Douglas R. Keyer, Jr.

Captain Douglas Keyer is a 20-year member of the New York State Police and currently serves as the Director of the New York State Intelligence Center. Captain Keyer entered the NYSP Academy in September 1988 and upon completion of basic training, was assigned to road patrol duties in Troop F. During his time as a Trooper, he also served as an Academy Training Officer and on the Governor's Executive Services Detail. In January 1997, he was promoted to the rank of Sergeant and assigned back to Troop F where he oversaw the activities of road patrol Troopers. In 1998, he was promoted to Sergeant/Station Commander staying in Troop F, SP Kingston. He subsequently transferred to Troop G, SP Loudonville, where he oversaw the operations of the Interstate Highway Patrol. In July 2000, he was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant and was assigned to Troop A, SP Batavia. In that capacity, he oversaw the investigations of major cases investigated by members of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation. Shortly after his assignment to Troop A, he was temporarily brought back to NYSP HQ in Albany, NY to work with three other Lieutenants writing the 2001 examinations for the position of Lieutenant and Sergeant. During that assignment, he was officially transferred back to NYSP HQ and served for three years as the Narcotics Administrative Lieutenant. In that capacity he was responsible for reporting NYSP counter-drug efforts to the Governor's Office, Drug Enforcement Administration and Department of Justice - Bureau of Justice Administration. On August 1, 2003 he transferred to the New York State Intelligence Center in Latham and was responsible for assisting with the day-to-day operations of the center, including all aspects of security. On October 19, 2006, he was promoted to Captain at the Center and is currently responsible for the day-to-day operations. These responsibilities include ensuring the Center meets and sustains fusion center baseline capabilities, private and public sector outreach, and information sharing in an all-crimes approach.

Captain Keyer currently participates in several national initiatives including as a voting member of the HSIN-Intel Steering Committee, a member of the ISE-SAR Evaluation Environment Steering Committee, and the Northeast Vice Chair for the Homeland Security – State and Local Intelligence Community (HS-SLIC). At the state level, he sits on the New York State Homeland Security Strategy Work Group.
