

Inspector Sean Montgomery

As the Commanding Officer of the NY-MTA Police Department's Interagency Counterterrorism Task Force, Inspector Montgomery oversees the task force from its oversight and the protection of the MTA's property and assets from potential terrorist attacks.

Inspector Montgomery has held a number of positions within his eighteen years with the MTA Police Department. As a Sergeant he was responsible for implementing and coordinating the district train patrol assignments and was also responsible for the front line supervision of his district's patrol officers. As Lieutenant, he oversaw a regional platoon tour within his district, supervising the officers and patrol supervisors of the district.

As a Captain he was assigned Commanding Officer of the MTA Police Department's patrol force and security initiatives within Queens and Kings Counties of New York City. As Deputy Inspector, he was the Executive Officer of Penn Station which covered Midtown to Downtown Manhattan. During Inspector Montgomery's tenure, he also served as the night-watch commander of the MTA Police in Penn Station during the 2004 Republican Convention. He also served as the Commanding Officer of the MTA Police Department's Directed Patrol System-Wide security initiative.

Inspector Montgomery now supervises the MTA Police Department's Interagency Counterterrorism Task Force which oversees the agencies intelligence gathering, counterterrorism initiatives, and emergency management and preparedness strategies within New York and Connecticut. He also commands a staff that is assigned to various intelligence and law enforcement agencies, including but not limited to Joint Terrorism Task Force, NYSIC, NYPD Counterterrorism, and several other intelligence agencies. He has worked on several critical infrastructure projects as it related to emergency preparedness, coordination, and evacuation within the MTA.

Inspector Montgomery holds a B.A. degree in Criminal Justice with a concentration on Police Administration from North Carolina Central University, and a M.S. in Justice Administration and Security from the University of Phoenix. He is a member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), a member of the New York State Chiefs of Police, a member of the Nassau County Chiefs Association, and a New York City Chapter Member, and a Region I member of the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives.
